

## GREENWOOD COUNTRY CLUB GOLF RULES

1. It is requested that all golfers register in the Golf Shop before each round of play. This rule applies to all players regardless of type of membership or guest status and whether walking or riding.
2. Monday of each week will be designated as maintenance day on the club golf course. This is a necessity for the proper maintenance of the golf course and greens and is a practice followed by all progressive clubs. Although some clubs close the course on Mondays, the Greenwood Country Club Course will open at 12:00 noon, but those who play on Mondays will have to take their chances with sprinklers operating on the greens and other procedures necessary for maintenance. The Golf Shop will be closed all day Monday.
3. Any person living in Leflore County or within a radius of 25 miles from Greenwood desiring to play golf must apply for membership in the club. We do reciprocate with the Leflore County Country Club and permit their members to play on all weekdays except holidays or during tournaments. All others desiring to play must be a member of a country club with which we have a reciprocal agreement and must be approved by the golf professional.
4. All guests wishing to play golf, including guests of members, must pay a greens fee as established by the Board of Governors, unless waived for a specified tournament. A member may invite a guest, 18 years of age or older, and from Leflore County or within a radius of 25 miles from Greenwood, to attend a round of golf **without playing, while in their presence**. However, the guest is responsible for paying a can fee. Only members are extended this privilege.
5. In order to maintain the best playing speed for all players, all groups shall tee off No. 1 tee from 12:30-2:30 p.m. on Wednesdays, weekends and holidays. Any groups, other than singles or twosomes, completing the first nine shall have the right of way on No. 10. Sixsomes and twosomes will be permitted at the golf professional's discretion. Any group desiring to tee off any hole other than No. 1 must first have permission from the golf professional.
6. A single or a twosome has no standing on the golf course and shall give way to all others.
7. The rules of etiquette must always be followed. Replace all divots, repair all ball marks on greens, smooth out footprints and ball marks in sand traps, tee off between markers and keep golf bags off tees and greens.
8. Personal range balls are not permitted on the golf course.

9. Practice shots to greens are not permitted.
10. A fine and/or cost of maximum damage shall be assessed by the Board of Governors to any golfer defacing or damaging a green, or any other part of the course, in any manner.
11. There will be an annual club storage and cleaning fee, billed quarterly.
12. No golf carts of any kind are permitted on the tees, greens or fringes.
13. When the course is too wet, as determined by the professional staff, golf carts will not be permitted.
14. No pull carts are permitted on greens or putting surfaces.
15. Golf carts may not be driven by children under 15 years of age.
16. Not more than two may ride in a golf cart at a time. More than two golf bags will be allowed, but only with the approval of the golf professional.
17. When golf carts are allowed, stay in the rough or on cart path until reaching point opposite ball, make 90 degree turn in the golf cart, proceed to the ball, hit the shot, return to cart path or rough and proceed in like manner until play on the hole is completed.
18. No food or beverage is allowed unless purchased from the club.
19. Proper golf attire will be worn at all times while on the golf grounds. Absolutely no swimming attire is allowed.
